## Freshman Wildcat goes on a Medical Mission!



WCS Freshman, Matthew Connell, recently returned from a medical mission trip to El Salvador. Below is an excerpt from a term paper Matthew wrote for Coach Casey Farris.

“My trip to El Salvador was an eye opening experience. To go to a poverty stricken country like that and coming from the richest and most powerful country in the world, is a real experience. I left on October 31, and when I first arrived I couldn’t believe my eyes! The city I stayed in was named Sonsonate.

My part on the trip was to help provide medical aide. The people cannot afford to buy medicine so my church group and I raised over \$20,000 worth of medicine and vitamins to give to the people. Our group was split into two smaller groups. One worked in the local hospital and one worked in the clinic, which we had set up for nine days. Over the time period of the trip we took care of nearly 2,500 people in less than eight days. This included surgeries, house visits, clinic patients, and seeing people in the streets. In this country the people have the sicknesses of poverty. These include mainly: starvation, malnutrition, infectious diseases, cataracts, and with many people the sickness of having no future. It was an experience I shall never forget.”

## AP Scholars

For the first time in school history, Advanced Placement (AP) courses were offered to WCS students during the 2002-2003 school year. Twenty-nine students earned seventy-two grades in eight AP classes that added up to a successful beginning for the new AP curriculum. Only 15% of more than 1,000,000 high school students in over 14,000 secondary schools worldwide who took AP Exams performed high enough to merit the recognition of AP Scholar; three (3) WCS students received this honor.

Joon Bae and Marty Kaczmarek qualified for the National AP Scholar Award by earning an average grade of 4 or higher on a 5-point scale on all AP Exams taken, and grades of 4 or higher on eight or more exams.

William Long qualified for the AP Scholar with Honor Award by earning an average grade of at least 3.25 on all AP Exams taken, and grades of 3 or higher on four or more of these exams.

The WCS administration expanded the AP curriculum to thirteen classes for the current school year; additional classes are planned for the future.

## Art Students Shine Like Stars



Amid the chatter of the lunch line and students changing classes in one of the busiest halls at WCS, hangs a classic work of art. Students in Mrs. Karen Keese's art class have mimicked the technique of artist Vincent Van Gogh to create their own version of a "Starry Night."

Each student was assigned a portion of the picture to recreate and then all of the pieces were put together to make a life-size version of the classic painting. Students had to work together in order to make sure their piece matched up well with their classmates' pictures. "This project is like making a quilt and everyone has a square to finish. When the squares are finished, we put it together to make a big picture," said 8<sup>th</sup> grader Travis Meadors.

"We are hoping to go see the real thing at the museum's special showing," said Mrs. Keese.

## What's New at the WCS Library?

**Question: "What's new in the Lower School Scarbrough Library?"**

**Answer: "Nearly everything!"**

Up until this school year, the Scarbrough Library was the only library at WCS. But, with the building of Mundy Hall, the Upper School has a brand new, state of the art library facility, yet to be named.

Scarbrough Library, named for the late and long-time WCS Elementary Teacher, Jackie Scarbrough, is now indeed dedicated to lower school students. The new Scarbrough Library has been completely remodeled and refurnished, even expanded. The new library has been a big hit with students and parents alike.

The brilliant colors and "comfy" new furniture make Scarbrough Library an inviting place to read a book and that is precisely what students are doing more of this year. Along with the soft chairs and new rugs, a miniature



house (built by a WCS Eagle Scout), tops the list of favorite places for young students to snuggle up and read a book.

Other items added in the refurbishing of the library include six tables, twenty-five chairs, twenty-five feet of new shelving, carpeted reading center, glass walls, plus the free-standing book-case modules were repositioned to allow for more student visibility. A new, brightly colored tile floor was installed along with new lighting and a new entrance.

### Library Resources Added:

Sixteen new databases were added to the upper school library for research purposes. The wealth of information includes information on literature, authors, biographies, science, geography, maps, Spanish, & Texas Almanac, news articles written on all age levels, encyclopedias for both lower school and upper school students, as well as teachers and administrators. WCS is blessed with the finest of library facilities and staff.



## Wildcat Football

Wildcat football fans are learning to be patient and loyal. Even if the 2003 'Cats were younger, smaller and less experienced than their opponents, they won the respect and hearts of the fans. Every Friday night the stands were nearly filled to capacity with students, parents, faculty, friends and alumni.

Boasting the most experienced, although new coaching staff, fans had high hopes for their Wildcat team. They were not disappointed! The growth and unity of the team became more and more apparent as the season progressed. Head Coach Stan Caffey had thirty-one players on the team, of which twenty-one were freshmen and sophomores; many had never played football before. Without question this was a "learning" experience, one that Coach Caffey is not anxious to repeat. By all indications he won't have to. Team members are already hard at work in their off-season program and no less than twenty prospective players have inquired about attending WCS next fall.

Coach Caffey who has twenty-five years of experience coaching high school and college football has breathed new life into WCS football. His first contribution was MOE! MOE is an acronym that was introduced to the players during summer workouts. It stands for *more of everything!* In the most positive technique, Coach Caffey continually instructed and encouraged his "rookie" squad to do better "everyday!"

His "thumbs-up" signal on kick-offs quickly caught on with the players and fans that united them in spirit and action. This was just one more sign of Coach Caffey's positive leadership and enthusiasm.

Of the six Wildcats who were named to the All-District team, first year player Jason Rizzotto and freshman DeMarcus Perry were picked for the first team. Another first team pick was senior Michael Caudle. Second team players included Miles Carlson, Andrew Long, and Richard Pettis.

WCS football fans can expect more new traditions to surface as the Wildcats look to the future with experience, confidence and unity.

## Wildcat Basketball Among Nations Best

Several "experts" in the arena of high school basketball have stated in the national media that the Academy National Invitational Tournament held every December in Houston is one of the nation's best high school basketball events. It always features the top prep teams from across the nation in one bracket and the best prep teams from the Houston area in the other bracket. The tournament just completed its third year of competition and Westbury Christian's Wildcats have been invited all three years, twice to play in the national bracket and once to play in the Texas bracket.

For such a tiny school as WCS to be included in this prestigious tourney speaks volumes for the quality of the WCS roundball program. Head Coach and Athletic Director Greg Glenn welcomes the competition; "It only makes our kids better, win or lose," states Glenn. "It is not the size of the school," says Glenn, "It is the size of the players' heart!" Glenn and his hard-working assistants Reed Sutton and Casey Farris train champions and settle for nothing than the players' best effort. As devoted Christian men, these coaches utilize every opportunity in basketball to teach Christ and Him crucified to their players, directing and leading them to live righteous lives.



Parents have moved from various parts of Houston to have their son in the Wildcat basketball program. Their pay-off has been huge! Thirteen former Wildcats are currently playing in Division I colleges and universities, plus one player last year, Ndudi Ebi, was an NBA first round draft pick right out of WCS. Accomplishments like these speak for themselves. This year the Wildcats won 2 out of 3 in the Academy Tournament defeating two excellent teams, Strake Jesuit and Clements High School.
