Selective rolling admissions are based on application, teaching recommendations, interview with high school principal, and OLSAT and ISEE scores.

SCHOOL CALENDAR

The school calendar is divided into 4 terms, 2 semesters over the course of the school year.

The school day consists of 8 periods beginning at 7:40am and concluding at 3:25pm

STUDENT ACTIVITIES

High school students are required to participate in at least one extra-curricular activity per year. WCS is a member of Texas Association of Private and Parochial Schools (TAPPS), which offers competitions in academics, band, drama, art, and athletic events.

SPIRITUAL LIFE

Chapel assemblies, devotionals, class prayers and daily Bible classes are the standard at WCS. Students learn biblical teachings and Christian principles from dedicated Christian educators. Teachers encourage students to develop Christian leadership skills for use in their homes, communities and churches. Students participate in chapel every Tuesday and Thursday.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

WCS follows the TEA Foundation High School program and offers several state-recognized endorsements. In addition to core classes, students earn one Bible credit every year. Students must earn 28 credits to graduate.

In addition, WCS requires 20 hours of community service per year. Students entering after freshman year are not required to make up Bible credits.

CLASS RANK & GPA

Class rank is calculated using a 100-point scale for a cumulative numeric average in credit classes with a numeric grade. In calculating the cumulative numeric average, 5 points will be added to the earned grade in Pre-AP classes and 10 points will be added to the earned grade in AP classes.
