Position Overview

The Head Football Coach at Westbury Christian School is called to lead a comprehensive football program that honors Christ, supports academic excellence, and develops student-athletes in mind, body, and spirit. This position requires a servant-leader who models Christian character, integrity, and humility while fostering a competitive and disciplined football program. The Head Football Coach reports to the Athletic Director and partners with campus administration, faculty, families, and the school community to advance the mission of Westbury Christian School.

Program Leadership and Management

- Responsible for planning, organizing, and implementing instruction in football fundamentals, strategies, rules, and proper conditioning appropriate for high school student-athletes.
- Instruction and preparation should emphasize effort, accountability, teamwork, and perseverance while reflecting biblical principles.
- Ensure the safety and well-being of all participants by inspecting facilities and equipment, monitoring environmental conditions, and modeling responsible stewardship of school resources.

Athlete Accountability, Character, and Spiritual Development

- Plays a vital role in mentoring student-athletes through consistent expectations for academic responsibility, personal conduct, and spiritual growth.
- Work directly with athletic administration to support student eligibility requirements, and maintain open communication with teachers and administration.
- Cultivate character, encourage servant leadership, and help guide athletes to represent Christ through their actions, attitudes, and sportsmanship both on and off the field.

Compliance, Operations, and Stewardship (TAPPS Alignment)

- Ensure full compliance with all Texas Association of Private and Parochial Schools (TAPPS) rules, regulations, and eligibility requirements, as well as all policies established by Westbury Christian School. This includes adherence to TAPPS standards related to eligibility, classification, scheduling, playoffs, sportsmanship, and ethical conduct.
- Assist the Athletic Director with the development of football schedules, preparation of required reports, coordination of contests, and securing of officials for varsity home games.
- Demonstrate integrity, accountability, and faithful stewardship of school resources while representing Westbury Christian School in a manner that honors Christ and reflects the school's mission and values.

Staff Leadership and Christian Mentorship

- In collaboration with campus administration and the Athletic Department, the Head Football Coach will assist in the supervision, coordination, and evaluation of assistant football coaches.
- Lead with humility, encourage professional and spiritual growth among staff, and foster a unified coaching culture that reflects Christian values. Coaches under this leadership should feel supported, challenged, and aligned with the mission of the school and the growth of athletics.

Communication and Community Engagement

- Maintain clear, respectful, and consistent communication with students, parents, faculty, staff, and the broader community.
- Promote the football program in a manner that reflects excellence, gratitude, and leadership. This includes celebrating achievements, encouraging community involvement, and partnering with families as co-educators in the development of student-athletes.

Qualifications and Experience

- Candidates must hold a bachelor's degree, with a master's degree and valid Texas Teacher Certification preferred.
- Applicants should have a minimum of five years of varsity-level coaching experience, with football coordinator experience preferred.
- A strong understanding of TAPPS regulations, football fundamentals, and high school athletic development is required.

- Candidates should demonstrate a clear commitment to Christian education and the ability to integrate faith, leadership, and athletics in daily practice.

Physical and Working Conditions

The Head Football Coach must be able to work both indoors and outdoors in varying weather conditions, including extreme heat, and meet the physical demands of coaching, including standing, walking, bending, kneeling, and lifting equipment weighing up to 40 pounds. The role requires flexibility in schedule, including evenings, weekends, travel, and extended hours. The ability to maintain emotional control, model Christ-like behavior under pressure, and lead with grace is essential.

Faith and Mission Alignment Statement

Applicants must affirm their commitment to the mission, vision, and statement of faith of Westbury Christian School. The Head Football Coach is expected to model a personal relationship with Christ, integrate biblical principles into leadership and coaching practices, and support the spiritual mission of the school through word and example.
